

## Pupil Premium 2014

The school received £118,200 Pupil Premium funding for the financial year 2014 – 2015. This money will be used in the following ways:

<b>Measure</b>	<b>Cost</b>
To employ a Pupil Premium Co-ordinator to support learning through interventions with those pupils identified as requiring support.	£14,500
To pay for additional teachers in the most vulnerable year groups, making classes less than 24 pupils.	£100,000
Breakfast and After School Club is offered for free to identified vulnerable children.	£5,000
To employ a Family Support Adviser to work with families who have identified themselves as requiring support.	£21,000
Additional adults have been employed to support children who are vulnerable and not making expected progress.	£35,000
To provide fruit to all children in school at break times.	£700
