Welcome back!

We hope you all had a fantastic break and it is great to see all the children settle so quickly back into the school routine

This term the children will be focusing on:

Personal Social and Emotional development:

- This will continue to be a large focus this term. Through the use of many traditional tales, we will begin to think about how the actions of characters within the story make others feel
- We will be encouraging children to share and take turns through collaborative games. Supporting them to listen to each other and respond appropriately to others

Communication and Language:

- Listening to a range of stories and joining in with repeated phrases and adding actions as we retell them together
- Developing our understanding of questions, including 'how' and 'why' and beginning to use more complex sentences
- Listening to a range of stories and responding with relevant comments and questions
- We will be using our speaking, listening and questioning skills during 'show & share' sessions about our favourite books. Letters about this were sent home last term and a timetable to show when your child has their show and share time is on display on the FS1 notice board


Physical development:

- Lots of action and movement games to develop confidence and coordination with our large gross motor skills
- Safely using a wide range of one handed tools and mark making resources to develop the use of a tripod grip to make marks and begin to form recognisable letters. We will be practising writing our names too!
- Children will continue to be supported to be independent in their self-care skills, such as getting ready for outside play. Full time and afternoon children will also take part in our toothbrushing scheme from Monday 18th February

Mathematics:

- Using counting skills in a wide range of activities, songs and games; building up number recognition skills and matching numerals to quantities
- Using number language through play and reciting number names in order
- Exploring shape, patterns and size; talking about the shape of everyday objects and ordering objects by size and height
- Using positional language and beginning to use mathematical names for shapes

Literacy:

- Stories linked to our traditional tales topic; including Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Billy Goats Gruff and Jack and the Beanstalk
- Use books, puppets and imaginative play props to learn about story structure and use story language to retell traditional tales
- Building on our mark making skills by giving meaning to our marks and drawings

Expressive Arts and Design:

- Exploring using a range of construction resources to build and balance
- Creating movement and dance in response to music and stories
- Acting out stories and adding a narrative to imaginative play

Understanding the World:

- Learning about each other's families and sharing what we do at home as we play imaginatively, as well as special events
- Using a range of technological resources to build up our skills
- Exploring a range of materials as we build bridges with The Billy Goats Gruff!
- Talking about living things and how plants grow with Jack and his beanstalk!
