### Reading

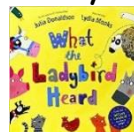
#### What the Ladybird heard

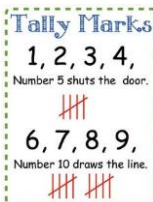
### Understanding the World
