Previous Learning:

I should understand and follow the Bee rules


I should write my name to label a model or picture










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Support available for children:

Adults will be supporting children as they play in order to learn about their strengths and any areas of need

The RBA baseline will be completed, giving your child 1:1 time with their class teacher.

- Physical Development activities to support children with their pencil grip and fine motor control and to 'Squiggle while they Wiggle!'. We aim for all children to have a tripod grip- ask your child to 'nip, flip and grip!'
- Introducing lots of songs, rhymes and stories to make books and print exciting
