Intent:

This term we are focusing on recapping all the key skills the children have learnt throughout their time in FS2. We will be getting them ready to transition to Year 1 and have lots of time to look round Year One and answer any questions the children may have about their new adventure in Year One in September.

Our Explorer topic will take the children around The World exploring different places, including Africa, where they will learn about how life can be different in other cultures and countries. We will also learn about the different animals and their habitats- including a visit from Wild Science. Children will handle and learn about lots of creatures! We will also follow the children's interests and explore a range of countries and learn about animals the children would like to know more about.

Implementation~ Our Sticky Knowledge Aims:

information children will learn

To learn about animals in Africa and their habitats.

To learn about life in Africa and what is similar and different to where we live.

To continue to develop the children's independent writing skills through a range of genres, such as fact files and stories.

To write sentences independently using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

To speed up recall of the number bonds for 5 and then 10.

To continue to develop the children's recall of the composition of numbers to 10 and their corresponding subtraction facts.


To become confident identifying patterns in numbers, such as odd and even.

To recall doubles to at least 5 and halves of even numbers to 10.

To explore maps and what they can tell us about The World.

Impact: Where did our previous learning journey take us?
